#### **Gift Shop**

# Wednesday 6th December - Bring in a Gift Day (Years 1-8)

Each child comes to school bringing 1 or 2 unwrapped gifts to donate to the Christmas Gift Shop. Gifts should be new and unused and approximately £6 in value. They must be brought in a bag with the child's name and form clearly marked so that these can be checked off in advance of Gift Shop Day.



#### Tuesday 12th December - Christmas Gift Shop Day

Each child chooses a maximum of two gifts (or one gift if they brought in just one gift) for parents, grandparents, etc. from the Gift Shop which will be in TOSH. These will be wrapped up for them to take home and give at Christmas. £6 (or £3 if just one gift is brought in/chosen) is then added to the end of term invoice.

It's helpful when bringing in gifts that you think of what type of gift your child might choose for you and that the quality of the gifts is something you'd like to receive. The gift choice is endless: coffee shop vouchers, books, candles, tea sets, gloves, scarves, hats, umbrellas, gardening gifts, games, car equipment, pamper ideas etc. Please note, however, that there should be no gifts that contain alcohol, nuts, chocolate with nuts, glass, or knives/ blades. Unfortunately, many boxed chocolates do contain traces of nuts. It would really be appreciated if everyone could please follow these guidelines to avoid some of the difficulties that have occurred in the past.

This event is extremely popular with the children, but if you do not want your child to take part, please could you discuss this with them before the day as it is very difficult to cater for disappointed children who feel that they are missing out on the excitement with their friends.

We do require volunteers for this event to go ahead, so if you can spare some time to help receiving and checking gifts, setting up the gift shop, or wrapping gifts on the day, please complete the form on My School Portal under General Forms.



#### **Fledglings 1**

The Fledglings 1 have had lots of fun learning about stickman and listening to the stickman story. They have been exploring fake snow and real sticks. The children have had fun playing on the bouncy castle for wellbeing week. Fledglings 1 have been using their senses to explore the ice and arctic animal play. They have been having fun using different sized diggers to explore the sand play and have also been doing a stickman hunt around the classroom.

The Fledglings 1 have begun to get into the Christmas spirit by decorating the classroom and beginning to create their Christmas crafts. The children have also been practising their Christmas songs and exploring musical instruments ready for our Fledglings sing along!











#### Fledglings 2

Red and yellow and pink and green...wow, Fledglings 2 have been loving exploring colours! We have been learning about what colours we like and looking for objects to match. A chess game has been enjoyed using sorting bears to match, using amazing fine motor skills to thread string through coloured cotton reels, exploring with rainbow-coloured oats using spoons and making simple coloured sequence caterpillars. The children have had fun making coloured shape sun-catchers, shape pizzas, shape rockets, coloured paper towels and printing shapes. We have also had free play using crayons to draw shapes, making beautiful collages with different materials, hunting for treasure shapes as well as looking at hot/cold objects. As always, Fledglings 2 love to get messy so there has been mixing paint in shaving foam to explore the colours changing. I am sure you all have been hearing those beautiful singing voices practising for our special surprise soon!















#### **Lower Robins**

We've had an fantastic couple of weeks in Lower Robins! The children are getting really excited about Christmas and have been practising their songs for the Christmas concert at the end of this week. They've also been busy creating beautiful Christmas crafts.

Last week, we delved into 'The Tiger who came to tea' story. The children had so much fun drawing their own tiger pictures and painting with black and orange. Lower Robins were so excited to have a bouncy castle in the nursery and they had such a great time on it! This week, we've been learning all about Arctic animals. The children had a great time exploring ice in the tuff tray and painting ice cubes!













#### **Upper Robins**

Last week in Upper Robins we have been looking at the 'Stick Man book'. The children have loved listening to the story and answering questions about the story, they were even able to predict what would happen next in the book. The children have enjoyed painting with sticks, exploring natural resources in the messy tray, exploring frozen natural resources and using different tools to free the materials. The children had great fun on Monday of wellbeing week when they used our big bouncy castle, they loved jumping and rolling around!

This week the children have been enjoying all things Christmas. We started off the week with creating our own snow man by adding different things to our large snowman in the tray, such as orange noses, googly eyes, and different materials for his buttons. They enjoyed exploring the shaving foam on the snowman and making marks in the snow tray. We have been participating in lots of special Christmas crafts ready to take home in our special Christmas bag, which we have also been making - creating Christmas cards, completing our decoration for the tree, and making calendars. The children have also enjoyed guessing what's inside the present!

















#### **Skylarks - Green**

We completed our topic on 'transport' and really brought this theme to life by engaging in make-believe play in the station role play area, buying tickets and setting off on imaginary journeys. Creatively, we also reinforced this focus with amazing 'junk' models and cute sail boats, displaying the children's initials on the sails. Everybody enjoyed exploring the natural environment during Forest School, culminating in a warming cup of hot chocolate!

This week the children started their individual Christmas crafts, combining different media and materials to create varied festive effects for their cards, calendars and tree decorations. The role play area transformed into Santa's Workshop and the children helped Santa by working hard at the tool bench to make some 'toys'. We created scenarios at the snowy tuff tray and 'small world' polar table and then engaged in an activity trying to guess what was inside the foil-wrapped presents by simply feeling them and studying their shape.















#### **Skylarks - Orange**

Last week, Skylarks Orange had another busy week and the children really enjoyed the extended transport activities. They created some wonderful transport vehicles using the junk modelling. We had spaceships and mega big buses that went down bumpy hills and up mountains! They also enjoyed making marks with cars in the paint trays. The children made maps and pictures out of car wheels.

This week we have been so busy making our Christmas crafts for our family, however, we can't tell you what we've been busy making! But we're sure your all love our Christmas gifts and crafts we have been creating. We have also been exploring snowy scenes in the tuff tray!







#### OAK

Oak have been busy preparing for the Nativity performance by practising songs, dance moves, and the Christmas story they will be retelling. They have loved learning the songs and learning about the Christmas story.

As part of our topic, Oak has been studying weather, with a particular focus on wind and ice. We have constructed various types of kites and wind tubes to investigate the properties of wind. Afterwards, we tested them outside to determine which kite was the most effective. Through our scientific investigation, we discovered that the plastic parachute was the most efficient at flying. We have also been making paper plate snow globes, writing winter descriptions and creating our own press printing.


In maths, we have been looking at the composition of 4 and 5, deepening our exploration of how these numbers can be shown and made. We have also been looking at 4 sided shapes in the classroom and the local environment. The children have additionally been counting forwards and backwards from any number.










Exploring place value - the children partitioned numbers and were challenged to write 4 number sentences to show this.









Letters arrived at the Year 1 classroom doors from Electra, the Queen of the dragons. In the letter the children were told that three eggs might have been dropped in the Chestnut playground and if they were found please could they be kept safe. Year 1 excitedly looked around the playground to locate them. Three were found and are safely in the Year 1 classrooms. The children are now writing replies to Electra!








Year 1 has been learning about shadows and light in their science lessons. Even though it was a rainy day with no sunshine, the children still had lots of shadow fun with their whiteboard lights!















Year 1 enjoyed a visit from Surrey Fire Service. They learnt about calling the emergency number, looked at some of the tools kept onboard and were very excited to look inside the fire engine. The highlight of the visit was squirting water from the hoses!















Year 2 have been investigating and testing the properties of materials. We discovered that tinfoil and plastic are the most waterproof materials as they are not very absorbent. In small groups we made a boat for Paddington, thinking carefully about the shape so that not only would it float, but would also be able to carry his heavy suitcase full of marmalade sandwiches!















#### Art

Inspired by Van Gogh, and linked to our History of Hazelwood topic, Year 3 have had great fun creating "Hazelwood on a Starry Night" pastel drawings. We have been studying one of Vincent Van Gogh's most famous paintings, Starry Night, observing the range of rich blue colours he used in the sky, with accents of yellow and white to represent the light radiating from the stars and the Moon.

We have also been analysing the way he painted using lots of short brushstrokes and thick layers of texture in his painting, creating swirling patterns. We then applied these skills, adding our creative flair to create our own imaginative pictures.







#### **WANTED!**

Year 4s have designed "Wanted" posters for Dick Turpin in Art, using their descriptions they wrote in English where they practised expanded noun phrases and powerful verbs.

Here are some examples of their expanded noun phrases: vicious criminal with jet-black boots ghostly cloak around crooked shoulders sharp dagger in blood-stained hands





Year Four used our debating skills and persuasive language to argue whether they thought Dick Turpin was innocent or guilty. It was a lively debate with some excellent points being made.











During their Friday form time, 5J have been giving presentations on their hobbies, holidays, and interests. So far Rohan has made a presentation on his family's celebration of Diwali, Bella Payne on her hobby - bouldering and Bea brought in a selection of artefacts and told the class about her holiday in Oman.
















#### **Buddies**

# Supported Lodgings & Foster Care with Surrey County Council



Supported lodgings and fostering are both incredibly rewarding experiences that can transform the lives of the children/young people being supported and the carers' themselves. Children and young people who enter the care system have often experienced trauma and instability in their lives, and a stable and supportive carer family can make a significant difference in their wellbeing and development.

Nationally, there are currently over 70,000 children living with carer families in the UK. However, there is a significant shortage of supported lodgings and foster carers, with around 9,265 new carer families needed in the next year alone. In Surrey, there are over 1,000 children in care and Surrey County Council have just under 400 carer families.

Supported Lodgings is targeted at young adults aged 16-21 to help them build skills ready to live independently in the future, from the security of a caring, stable home environment.

Supported lodgings carers and foster carers come from all walks of life and backgrounds; there is no one-size-fits-all approach. Whether you are single or married, young or old, own your own home or rent, you can become a carer. The most important thing is a willingness to provide a safe and loving home for a child in need.

If you have ever thought about fostering, or offering supported lodgings, now is the time to take that first step and find out more. The more people who consider caring, the greater the chance of finding loving, stable homes for children in Surrey who desperately need them.
